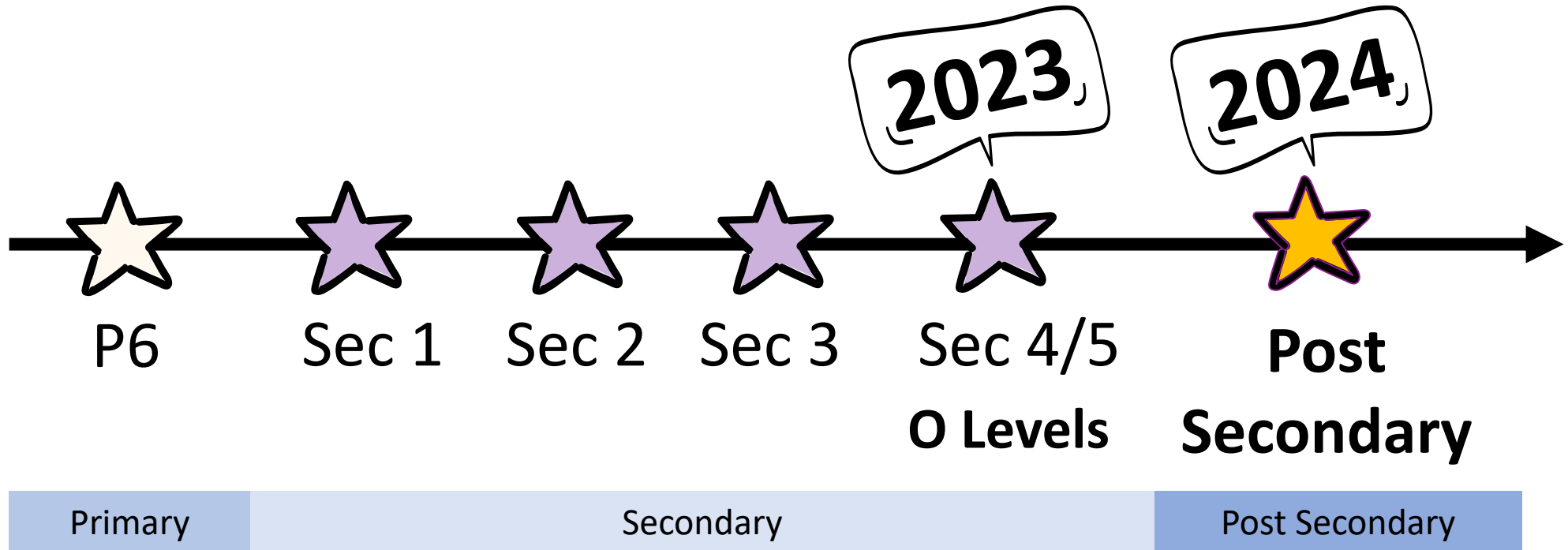

Know the Post-Secondary Course Requirements



1. Strengths

Your child's **strengths** in the subjects - realistic expectations of your child's ability to cope with the demands of various subjects.



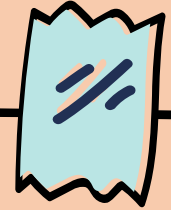
2. Interests

Your child's **interests** and hence the intended course of study beyond secondary school.



3. Aspirations

Engage your child in conversations and activities to explore their career **aspirations**.

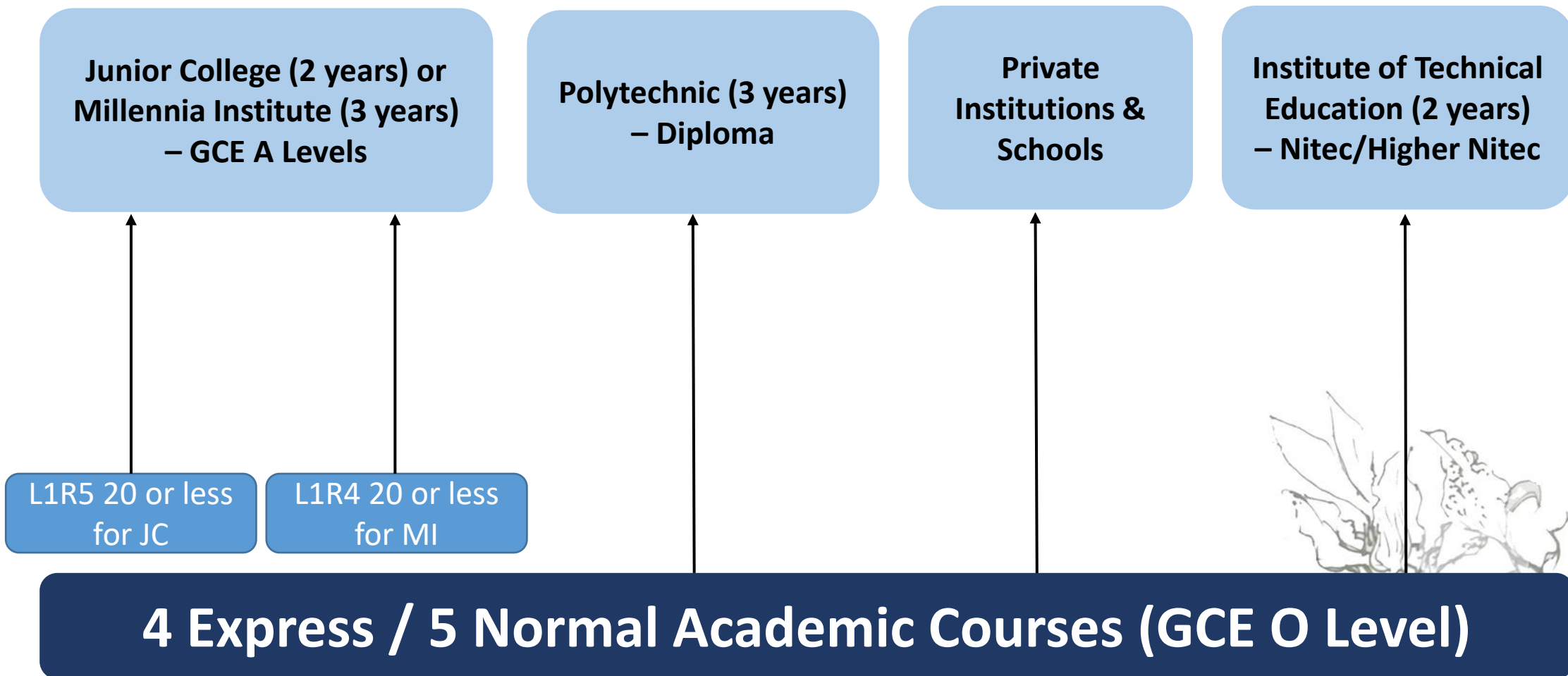


4. Requirements

The **requirements** for the course your child intend to pursue after secondary school.

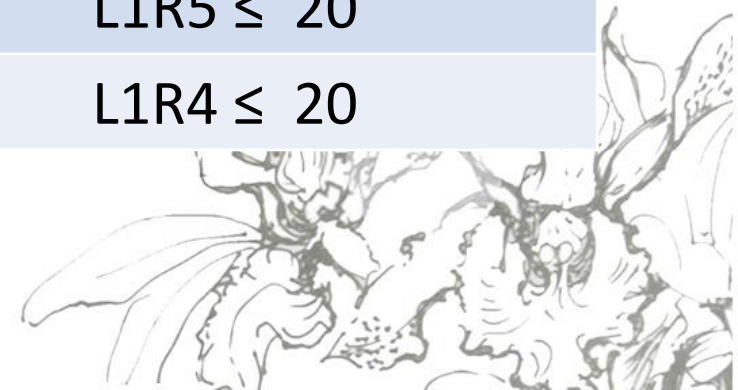

Junior College / Millennia Institute

JCs and MI primarily prepare students for a tertiary education. JC students are equipped with the skills and knowledge to prepare them for the A-level examinations in 2 years, while MI students 3 years. These skills and knowledge will also **prepare students for a university education which is the main aim of an A-level education.**

Institution	Length of study	Cut-off Points
Junior College	2 years	L1R5 ≤ 20
Millennia Institute	3 years	L1R4 ≤ 20





Know the Post-Secondary Course Requirements

To qualify for JC admission:

L1R5 (First Language + 5 Relevant Subjects) aggregate **score of 20 and below**. The L1R5 aggregate score is made up of the following subjects:

First Language (L1)	English/Higher Mother Tongue
Relevant Subject 1 (R1)	Humanities/Higher Art/Higher Music/Malay (Special Programme)/Chinese (Special Programme)/Bahasa Indonesia
Relevant Subject 2 (R2)	Mathematics/Science
Relevant Subject 3 (R3)	Humanities/Higher Art/Higher Music/Mathematics/Science/Malay (Special Programme)/Chinese (Special Programme)/Bahasa Indonesia
Relevant Subject 4 (R4)	Any GCE O-Level subjects (except Religious Knowledge)
Relevant Subject 5 (R5)	Any GCE O-Level subjects (except Religious Knowledge)

Know the Post-Secondary Course Requirements

To qualify for MI admission:

L1R4 (First Language + 4 Relevant Subjects) aggregate score of 20 and below. The L1R4 aggregate score is made up of the following subjects:

L1R4	Subjects
L1	English or Higher Mother Tongue Language (MTL)
R1, R2	<ul style="list-style-type: none">•Any 2 of these subjects: Humanities•Higher Art•Higher Music•Mathematics•Science•Malay (Special Programme)•Chinese (Special Programme)•Bahasa Indonesia
R3, R4	Any 2 GCE O-Level subjects except Religious Knowledge

What does one study at the 'A' Levels?

Select content subjects from **three** levels of study

H1	H2	H3
Half of H2 in terms of curriculum time	Equivalent to 'A' Level subjects prior to 2006.	Subjects with opportunity for in-depth study (e.g. advanced content, research paper, university module).

three H2s + one H1 content subjects
 (one which must be contrasting)
 + General Paper + Project Work

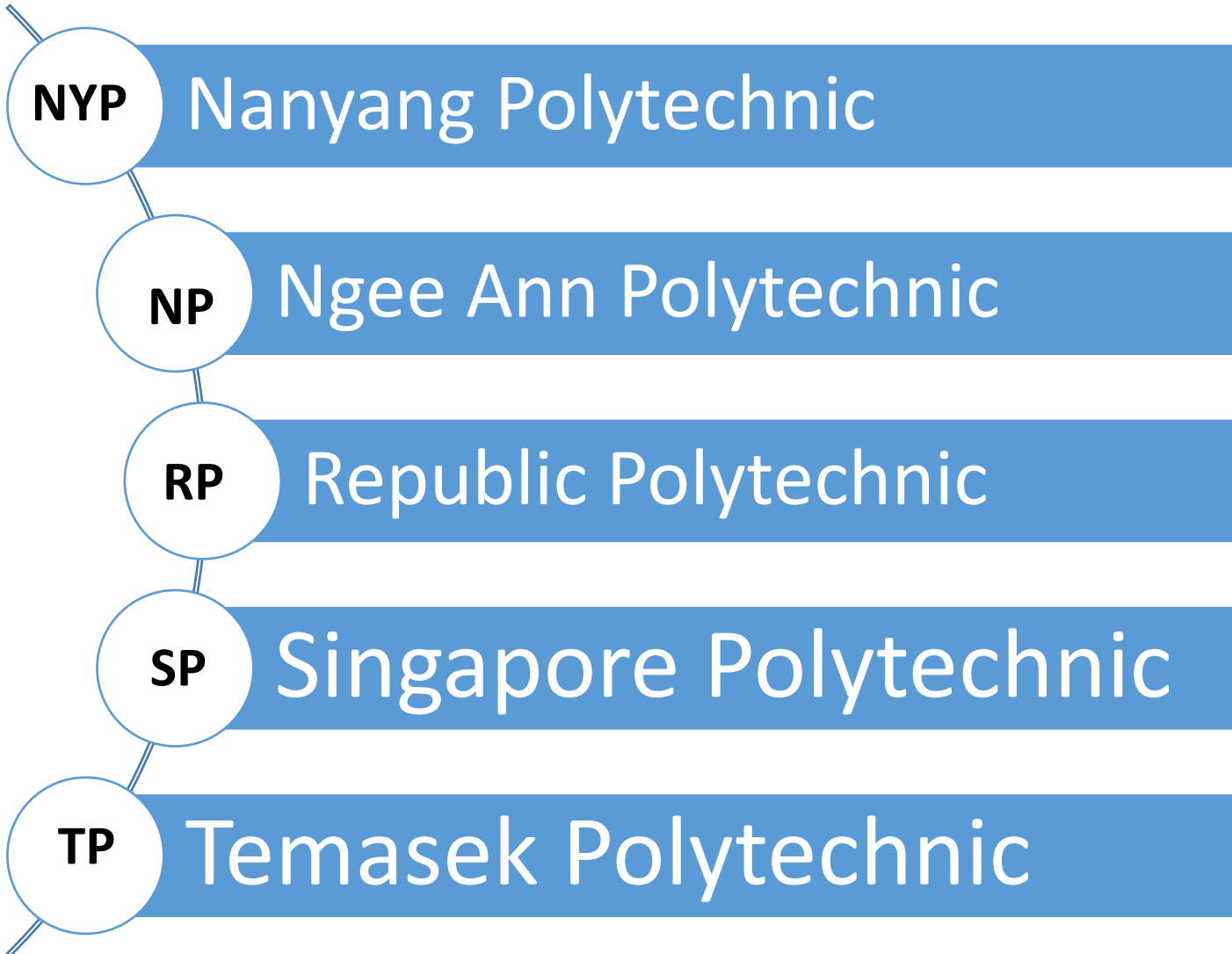

If applied for and was selected for the CLEP, MLEP or TLEP	2

Note: Candidates must qualify for JC/MI Entry first by obtaining 20 points & below before Bonus Points can be used.

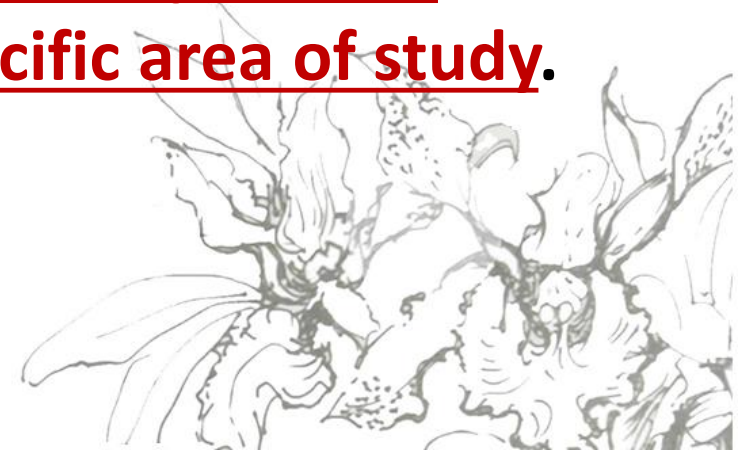


Admission to Polytechnics



Courses are hands-on and focus on preparing students for work

Students graduate with a Diploma in specific area of study.



Entry into Polytechnic

Through the Joint Admissions Exercise (JAE)

ELR2B2 is used for admissions into the polytechnics.

- English Language
- 2 RELEVANT subjects for the course applied for
- 2 other best subjects

Students must also **meet the minimum entry requirements** for the course they want to pursue.

Net aggregate score must not exceed 26 for all courses

Admission via DSA-JC and Poly EAE

Direct Schools Admission for junior colleges (**DSA-JC**) for **O-level** students

- allows students to apply to a DSA JC before taking the GCE O-Level examinations.
- can **apply based on your talent in sports, CCAs and specific academic areas that may not be demonstrated at the O-Level examinations**

Polytechnic Early Admissions Exercise (**Poly EAE**) for **O-Level** students

- an **aptitude-based admissions** exercise that allows students to apply for and receive conditional offers for admission to polytechnics prior to receiving their final grades.
- allows the polytechnics greater flexibility to select and admit students based on their aptitudes and interests, apart from academic grades, thus allowing a wider range of talents to be recognised.

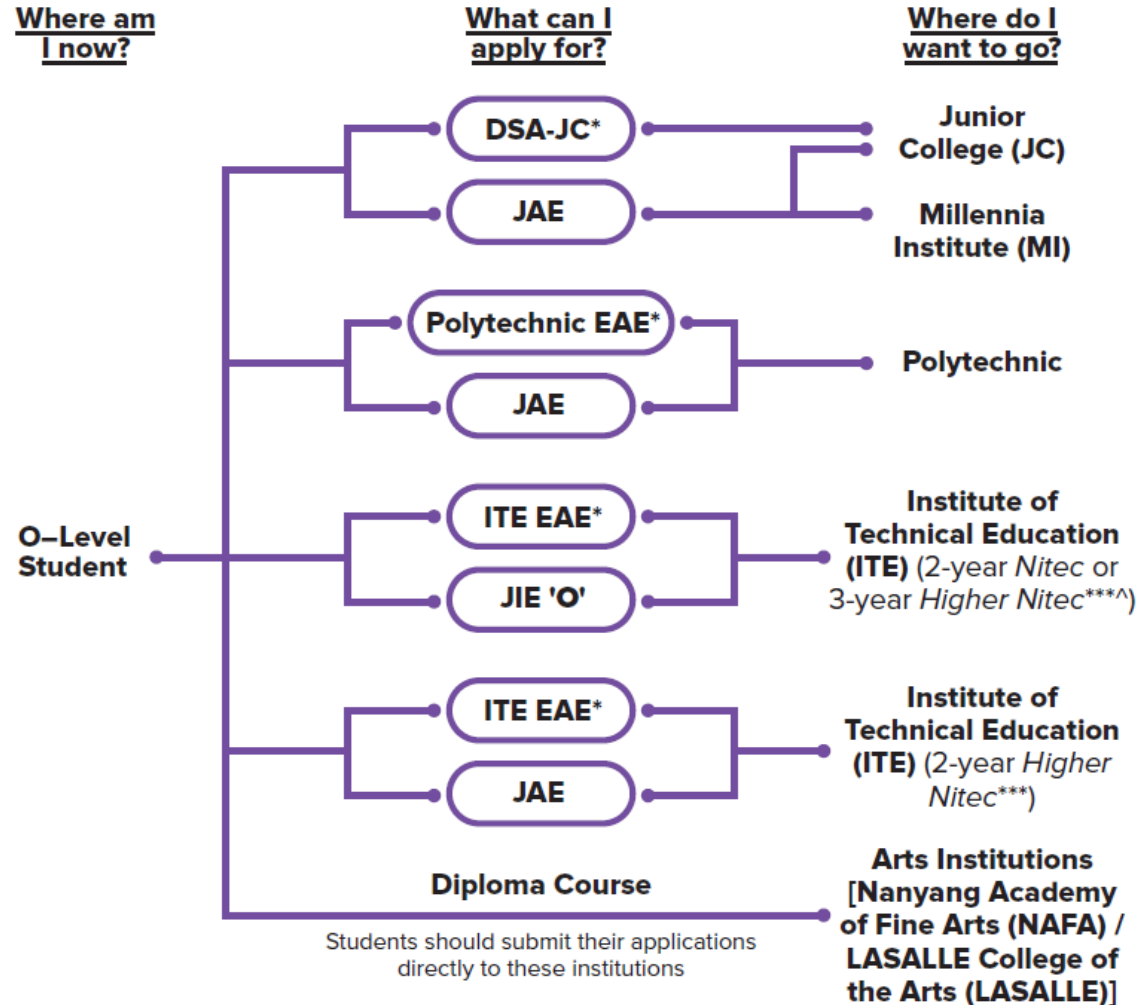
